* Initiating applications that seek interim **AND** final orders also attract the interim order fee. Example:

- Initiating Application (Parenting **AND** Financial) \$545 + Interim order application \$115 = **Total filing fee \$660**
- Initiating Application (Parenting **OR** Financial, Final) \$330 + Interim order application \$115 = **Total filing fee \$445**

If you hold certain Government concession cards or you can demonstrate financial hardship, you may be eligible for:

[^] a reduced fee for an application for divorce (both parties must be eligible if filing a joint application) or decree of nullity. For all other applications you may be eligible for an exemption of fees.

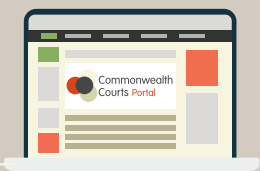

or by mail using:

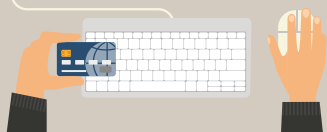
- VISA and Mastercard
